found for Rogers with Ronald Greene Ltd., nor with Greene & Rogers.) The firm's name became Greene & Rogers 1939-1942. Greene began working with Kingsport, TN architect Milton P. Robelot in 1948. It is first listed in the 1950 city directory, forming the firm Greene & Robelot. Greene moved to Gastonia in 1951.
